Advent Candle Lighting - The Welliver Family

Reader 1: This Advent season, we remember the adventures of Joseph, Zechariah, Simeon, and Mary, passed down from long ago in Holy Scripture. These narratives are signs that God shall always care for us. May they remind us of God's love for God's people.

Reader 2: These stories proclaim the truth of God's faithfulness in and through Jesus Christ. This morning, we light the first three candles, including the sage green candle, which represents Simeon. Simeon was a man who had foreseen the coming of the Messiah in scripture and had waited and prayed that one day he would see the Messiah with his own eyes. Light the first three candles


