Sunday, April 12, 2020 Easter Sunday



Christ the Lord is Risen!

While labeled Sunday School, please feel free to use these ideas in a way that blesses your family. You do not have to do all the activities nor do you need to do them on Sunday morning. You can use whatever translation of the Bible or Children's Bible you have in your home.

Read: Matthew 28: 1-10

Activities and Background:

1. Get up early and go for a walk, as you walk read or talk about the scripture. Come back to your sidewalk/driveway and decorate it with "His is risen", "Christ is risen", "Jesus lives". I wonder what the women talked about as they went to the tomb?

Older exploration: Read Mark 16: 1-8; Luke 24: 1-11; John 20: 1-10 (These are the other gospel accounts of the First Easter.)

Compare to today's scripture.

I wonder why the accounts are not exactly the same?

I wonder why some parts are the same? Which parts are?

2. Call or text someone the Easter Good News. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were told to go tell the disciples. I wonder who you will tell?

Older exploration: In this scripture the women are called to believe, share and rejoice.

Can you find those three parts of the scripture?

I wonder how we can believe, share and rejoice?

3. Make Resurrection Biscuits (Empty Tomb Biscuits) and surprise someone.

1 package of crescent rolls

White granulated sugar and powdered cinnamon mixed

8 large marshmallows

Melted butter

Wrap the marshmallow in a triangle of dough. Smooth into a ball

Roll the ball in the melted butter

Roll the ball in the sugar cinnamon mixture

Place in a muffin paper in a muffin tin

Repeat 7 times till all marshmallows are used

Bake at 350 degrees for about 15 minutes

I wonder if you were surprised when you opened your baked biscuit?

4. Read the story again from a different Bible, while eating your Biscuits. Draw a picture to remind you of the story.
5. Say a prayer together.
