


Sunday School Lesson

Sunday, August 2, 2020 Ninth Sunday After Pentecost



“How great you are, Sovereign Lord! There is none like you; we have always known that you alone are God.”

While labeled Sunday School, please feel free to use these ideas in a way that blesses your family. You do not have to do all the activities nor do you need to do them on Sunday morning. You can use whatever translation of the Bible or Children’s Bible you have in your home.

Read: 2 Samuel 5: 1-5, 7: 18-29

Activities and Background:

David the youngest of Jesse’s sons has moved from shepherd boy to King through God’s guidance. While still a shepherd boy, God guided Samuel in finding David and anointing him. God prepared David for kingship through the experience with Goliath and in escaping from King Saul. Now David is crowned King.

1. Read the story and wonder.
 - I wonder what David looked like.
 - I wonder how David felt when he was crowned King.
 - I wonder who took care of the sheep he had been watching.
2. Younger children will like making crowns and pretending to be King.
 - I wonder what kings do all day.
 - I wonder what it feels like to be king.
 - I wonder what it feels like to be a king guided by God.
 - Older children can discuss what qualities make a Godly king.
3. In the scripture David recalls that God has done wonderful things for his family. Create a list of the things God has done for your family.
4. David gave thanks to God for all the things God had done. As a family give thanks to God – use a prayer, use a song, write a letter to God, write a poem, share your abundance with others, or draw a picture.
5. Reread or retell the story. Draw a picture to remind you of the story.
6. Now try memorizing the scripture written above.
