Twenty-third Sunday After Pentecost



“How can I help you?”

While labeled Sunday School, please feel free to use these ideas in a way that blesses your family. You do not have to do all the activities nor do you need to do them on Sunday morning. You can use whatever translation of the Bible or Children’s Bible you have in your home.

Read: 2 Kings 4: 1-7

Activities and Background:

Here is a widow, who under Mosaic law would have to sell her sons into indentured slavery to the debtors. She calls out to Elisha for help. A miracle happens. Children may have a difficulty grasping the miracle. But some things are just unexplained – a miracle. Children may have difficulty understanding that someone could take children to cover a debt. They may need to be reassured that they are safe.

1. Read the scripture story. Name the characters and the issue which is of concern.
2. Here is a chance for some waterplay. Get out the water tub and several containers of different shapes and sizes. Practice pouring from one container to another.
3. Bring out the playdoh or clay and make different pots and containers.
4. Is there a widow or a single parent you could help with a gift of unexpected love – some food? clothes for children?
5. Read the story again draw a picture to help you remember it.
6. End with a prayer asking for guidance in helping to make peace.
