Second Sunday After Pentecost



While labeled Sunday School, please feel free to use these ideas in a way that blesses your family. You do not have to do all the activities, nor do you need to do them on Sunday morning. You can use whatever translation of the Bible or Children's Bible you have in your home.

Read: Acts 4:1-31

Activities and Background:

Early Christians were imprisoned as they were seen as a threat to the Roman powers and to the Jewish religious leaders as well. So Christians were disliked by one group or the other, however, the Holy Spirit made the Christians brave and bold.

1. Read the scripture and wonder about the story with your child. I wonder what it is like to be in prison.
2. What would you tell other people about Jesus?
3. The Holy Spirit makes us brave and bold to talk about Jesus even when those around do not want to hear. Can you think of a time when you needed to be brave and bold to do the right thing when others around were doing the wrong thing?
4. Read the story one more time and then draw a picture to help you remember the story.
5. Can you count to 5000? That is how many people heard Peter and John's stories of Jesus. How many people have you told about Jesus?
6. Older children might be interested in helping a mission or learning about areas where Christians today are imprisoned and persecuted.
7. End with a prayer.
